If your journal is interested in hosting the 2012 National Conference of Law Reviews, please submit this completed form by **February 10, 2010**. If you need additional information, please contact Dana Brown, NCLR Editor, at 817-637-0526.

Each journal that submits an application will be invited to give a 10-minute presentation to the General Assembly of the 2009 National Conference of Law Reviews in Baton Rouge. AV may be arranged by contacting the Texas Wesleyan Law Review. Each school may, but is not required, to provide a small give away to the conference participants. The giveaway should not exceed \$3.00 per person. In addition to this giveaway, each school may give each conference participant a flyer, program, or other written information about the school's bid to host. The journal selected as host will become an ex-officio member of the Executive Board. At least one representative of the school **must attend** the Executive Board meeting on **the first Saturday of the 2011 NCLR Conference in Fort Worth, Texas**.
